Mr. Lacroix brings to the position over 25 years of political and diplomatic experience, with a focus on multilateral organizations, and on United Nations activities and programmes. His previous appointments include Ambassador of France to Sweden, Chief of Protocol of France, Deputy Permanent Representative at the Permanent Mission of France to the United Nations in New York, Deputy Chief of Mission at the French Embassy in Prague and First Secretary then Second Counsellor at the French Embassy in Washington.



Mr Munir Akram
(Permanent Representative, Pakistan's Permanent Mission to United Nations New York)

Ambassador Munir Akram joined the Foreign Service of Pakistan in 1967, holding various positions in the Foreign Ministry as Additional Foreign Secretary and Director-General United Nations. During his term at the United Nations, Ambassador Munir Akram served twice as President of the Security Council. He also served as Member of the UN Secretary General's Advisory Board on Disarmament, Chairman of the WTO Trade Policy Review Body and President of the Conference on Disarmament. He is currently serving as Permanent Representative of Pakistan to the United Nations, with the rank of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary.

Mr. Shahkar served as Punjab Police Inspector-General, Pakistan prior to joining the United Nations. He has more than 30 years of national and international policing experience, including 9 years with the UN at Headquarters and the field.
